Fondation Enfant Jesus (FEJ) is a non-denominational, non-profit organization based in Haiti since 1985 that aims to break the cycle of poverty by promoting sustainable human development for impoverished children and their families, through a comprehensive development programming including: Culturally Sensitive Education, Child and Family Education, Health Services, Construction and Improvement of the Community, Entrepreneurship support and the Complete Child and Family Protection Program.

Lamardelle School

Project Overviews

The "Lucienne A. Duncan Mixed Institution" (I.M.L.A.D.) In honor of Manmie Lucienne Ange-Lucie Duncan's mission is to bridge the growing literacy gap for poor children and their families in Lamardelle regardless of gender or creed. **We advocate that Education is freedom and power where the learning process is of great value and should be accessible to all children.** The school curriculum is managed in accordance with the criteria imposed by the Haitian Ministry of Education. The operation of the school has allowed the EFJ to have years of experience and knowledge allowing it to overcome multiple obstacles and learn how to better assess the needs of the community.

The I. M.L.A.D. provides primary and elementary education to the children of Lamardelle, a rural area not far from Croix-des-Bouquets. With the help of partners like FEJ-USA, AFEJ and Action Medeor, we were able to offer nutritional and medical care to the children. We are always striving to do more to continue to promote education in the Lamardelle community.

The pilot project proposed by the principal of the school, aimed at including the 3rd cycle of the fundamental where children will have the opportunity to continue their secondary education at school at the end of their primary cycle could only be implemented until the 9th basic year.

The school year began on 9 November 2020 due to the Covid-19 health crisis and ended on 14 June 2021 with a total of 135 consecutive school days. To begin the process of achieving the objectives set for the year, the

organization of the administrative and teachers' school year was organized on November 5, 2020. This was done in order to set up procedures and plan the necessary didactic materials in preparation for the reopening of classes. A meeting with teachers to define strategies to ensure a good start to the school year was also organized.

To pursue the objectives, on November 27, 2020, we gave educational books to the students of the primary section. As part of the maintenance of the school's relationship with the Ministry of National Education, the end-of-year decision lists and class training lists were submitted to the Ganthier school district. These follow-ups were effectively carried out with the aim of continuing to regularly meet the annual obligations of the Ministry (MENFP) vis-à-vis schools.

We have also continued during the school year our series of steps piled up for about two years with the Ministry of National Education in order to obtain the legal recognition of the school. A permit to operate application form was received at the Ganthier School District during the school year. This form was immediately transferred to the administration for the administrative follow-up.

For the 2020 end-of-year party, we had the opportunity again this year to organize a beautiful party for all our children on Tuesday, December 22, 2020. This year's party was also very cheerful despite the difficulties encountered. First, at the beginning of the day we organized a beautiful ceremony under the refectory in the presence of many parents who had come to see their children offering beautiful performances such as: choreographies, poetry, christmas songs etc. After the ceremony, a menu was offered to the children as usual and they were really happy to participate.

During the pre-carnival period, we also organized a great cultural activity for all the students of the school. Once again this year, the children had the opportunity to participate in an art workshop set up to encourage them to develop their senses of creativity and imagination. This year again the opportunity was offered to each child to develop his talent in the artistic field by carrying out work of dessins, painting, cutting / collage etc. During this activity, each child was able to make their own mask in order to take part in a large parade organized on the schoolyard.

Throughout the year, the school had also worked in perfect collaboration with the parents because it was felt that their participation could also play an important role in the training of the children. The idea of developing this relationship has allowed the school to increase the percentage of success of children each year. To maintain this relationship, we held four important parent meetings during the school year, depending on the organization of the school's annual schedule. The first meeting was held in October 2020 in order to plan with them the organization of the official start of the 2020-2021 school year, the second and third meetings were also carried out as a prelude to the evaluations of the first and second control in January and April 2021, and the fourth and last meeting was finally held in May 2021 to close the school year and announce the new measures that will be adopted for the next academic year 2021-2022.

In addition to the various meetings held with parents during the school year, we were also able to organize four large official meetings with teachers, each of which usually precedes each parents' meeting.

In addition to each of these meetings, several other meetings had also been held with them to the extraordinary. These meetings are often organized with the aim of ensuring the best application of the educational program used at school and compliance with the objectives set for each period.

During the school year, we designated three controls to assess children's performance:

1- The first check was carried out over the period from 25 to 29 January 2021 with a success rate of 86.36% and 13.64% failure.

2- The second control, from 19 to 23 April 2021 with a success rate of 82.98% 17.02%. failure

3- And the third check, from 10 to 14 June 2021 with a success rate of 86% and 14% failure.

Training received

Given the current contexts of the country and the financial problems we have faced during the year, it has been really difficult for us to give a certain number of in-service training as usual to our teachers. However, on May 17, 2021, on the occasion of the flag festival, we organized a great day of reflection and conference debate with our teachers. This conference was based around the theme "The problems of education in Haiti, the role of teachers in solving these problems".

This day of activity was very profitable for our teachers, and they were all equally satisfied.

The management staff had the chance to participate in two full days of training with the Psychologist, Mr. Wilcox Toyo on " stress management in difficult situations". These two days of training were very beneficial for the team. At the end of the second day, participants received a certificate attesting to their participation in this important training.

As part of the implementation of the various extracurricular activities planned for this year, a football championship was organized for students on the grass of the former FEJ nursery in Lamardelle during the months of April and May 2021. All matches were carried out in accordance with the schedule of the organization of the championship however, due to the rebound of the corona Virus pandemic in the country, a situation that forced us to proceed with the early closure of classes on June 14, 2021, the final was unfortunately not carried out on June 28, 2021 as planned. But despite this impediment, the children were still satisfied with the progress of this great activity.

We were also able to conduct the annual employee assessment during late May and early June 2021. The evaluation went very well thanks to the collaboration of the entire team, particularly management staff. This evaluation was carried out in order to assess the competence of the employees and define the conditions for the renewal of their contracts for the new academic year 2021-2022. At the end of the evaluation, a report was sent to the administration.

During this year, many improvements have been made in terms of children's nutrition. Thanks to the determination of Mrs. Danielle Fridel of AFEJ-Haiti and the support of the administration, we were able to continue to regularly offer every day at least two meals to the children following the organization of the menu of the week. The children have regularly received in their daily dishes a rich and well-balanced diet that essentially meets their needs in order to guarantee their productivity and the success of their school days.

We closed the school year with the completion of the evaluations of the third and last control, and then with the realization of an important meeting between the administrative staff and that of the teachers to thank them for their collaboration with the management in order to achieve the objectives that have been set for the 2020-2021 school year.

Child Protection Service

The Child Protection Service (SPE) has under its direction the crèche that participates in the integration mission. Our vision at the crèche is to be able to provide a hopeful future to a large number of abandoned, orphaned and needy people in the country. In addition to taking care of the physical needs and safety of these children, we also ensure that everyone receives individual love and attention. For children who do not have the chance to be adopted, while waiting to be with their permanent family, let us give them love, a framework for character development, education and opportunities to receive valuable skills that will allow them to be independent and ultimately be able to contribute to Haitian society and culture.

In order to respond to this, we had organized a whole set of activities that participate in the holistic development of the children in our care. Our intervention respects the right to Health, Education, Leisure and to have a Family in accordance with the Convention on the Rights of the Child. The EFJ believes that every abandoned or orphaned child deserves a loving home with parents who provide care, education and security.

This program is very important because it allows children to have a secure future while having access to love, affection, health care and education. It focused mainly on child protection, nutrition, education and health.

Thanks to volunteers and donors like you, the Child Protection Service was able to provide care to 35 children from the Crèche, 2 of whom were new admissions for this period. 1 child was admitted to an adoptive family and 4 children were reintegrated into their biological families.

Community Health Clinic

“Clinique Communautaire Enfant Jésus à Lamardelle” (CCEJL) is at the heart of the FEJ’s health care program. Access to health care is extremely difficult for residents of remote areas such as Lamardelle. The FEJ built the clinic to meet this need and ensure that the community of Lamardelle and surrounding areas have access to high quality health care. The clinic offers regular medical services, including vaccines, prenatal care, maternity, physiotherapy and paediatrics, as well as educational services, such as nutritional programs for children and pregnant women with the generous support of our donor Action Medeor.

The FEJ maternity project aims to strengthen the institutional care of pregnant women at the Clinic. Lamardelle has a high rate of maternal death. Almost all pregnant women living in the Lamardelle region (90%) give birth at home without the help of qualified staff. The maternity project seeks to change that. Our goal is to reduce the maternal and neonatal mortality rate by reducing the percentage of home births by 50% and increasing the use of qualified medical personnel during childbirth.

Donors and our other partners have allowed us to continue to meet the needs of our community.

Intensive Treatment Unit

This unit was set up in partnership with the Caris Foundation and involves working directly with sick or abandoned children to stabilize them. The main objective of the unit is to provide services especially to children living with HIV and malnutrition. This includes the provision of medical care, balanced meals and enrichment activities. The lead doctor in the program conducts research to determine the child's history, including parents and/or extended family, reasons for abandonment, family economic status, academic history and medical history.

Through this program, the specialized unit has the capacity to serve up to 25 children at a time: 0 to 6 years old, and also teenagers up to 18 years old. In general, it takes 3-4 months to stabilize a child (0 to 6 months) and carry out a thorough family assessment. Once both actions are completed, the child is transferred to the FEJ crèche for adoption (Haitian or international) or reunited with a family member. Since opening in April 2020, we have cared for 77 children at our unit.

2021 Snapshots

Summary of the first week of classes at I.M.L.A.D



The official start of the courses took place on Tuesday, September 8, 2020. This concerned exclusively the pupils of the primary section. Those in preschool had to wait their turn in December. There were nearly 100 students every day during that week. The goal of the management is to encourage children to study

in order to make up for missed classes. At school, students are required to wash their hands before entering class, after recreation, before meals.

Storm at Lamardelle

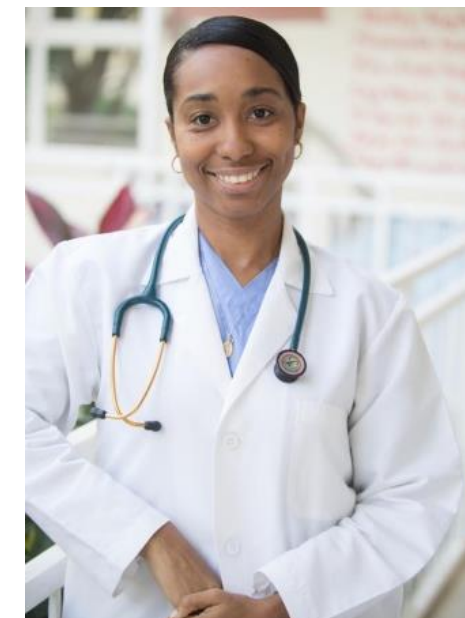

We have treated more than 77 patients in the Intensive Treatment Unit. Our nurses and doctor are happy to take care of the sickest children and provide the best possible care. We strive to organize parties and activities for the children of the unit in order to keep them busy. We love to see our patients improve every day.

A success story: Welcome home Roberto and Guerda!

In March 2021, a terrible gas explosion at the Port-au-Prince home of long-time EFJ employee Roberto left his wife Guerda with fatal burns. She needed immediate care at a specialized burn center that was not available in Haiti. Thanks to Jennifer Ash, a member of the FEJ-USA Board of Directors, and many others, she was transported from Haiti to Georgia on an emergency medical flight and care was provided at the Joseph M. Still Burn Center at Doctors Hospital of Augusta. After the first month of surgeries and specialized treatments, we were finally able to arrange a flight to Roberto in Georgia to accompany him during his recovery. A big thank you to Maison Chavis who hosted Roberto for the next 2 months! Special thanks also go to board member Himler François who spent many days traveling with Roberto, acting as an interpreter and helping to coordinate appointments and negotiate the charity review of important medical bills.

After numerous surgeries, in early June, Guerda was ready to be discharged from the hospital. There were still months of rehabilitation needed, so FEJ-USA Board Chair Lillian Dukes generously opened her home to Guerda and Roberto. There were many more medical appointments and follow-ups in June, July and August. After this 6-month ordeal, Guerda and her husband Roberto finally found their children at home in Haiti in September!

We are so fortunate to have such a generous network of supporters and volunteers who have helped make this medical recovery possible! Finally, we must also thank the qualified doctors and nurses at the Burn Center!



Earthquake in Haiti

In the early morning hours of August 14, 2021, a destructive magnitude 7.2 earthquake struck southern Haiti. More than 1200 lives have been lost and we feared that the number would continue to rise. Fortunately, our staff at the Child Jesus Foundation and the children in our care were all safe.

Although EFJ facilities are not in the southern region of Haiti where the earth tremor struck, we were able to send a team to help rescue the affected families. Mirlande Mila and our partner Reve Anaika were accompanied by a number of EFJ employees to deliver food, water and other essential supplies to homeless families. This was achieved thanks to our national and international donors, our sponsors and the ground support of the local community.



Barrels of Blessing: Food from Canada

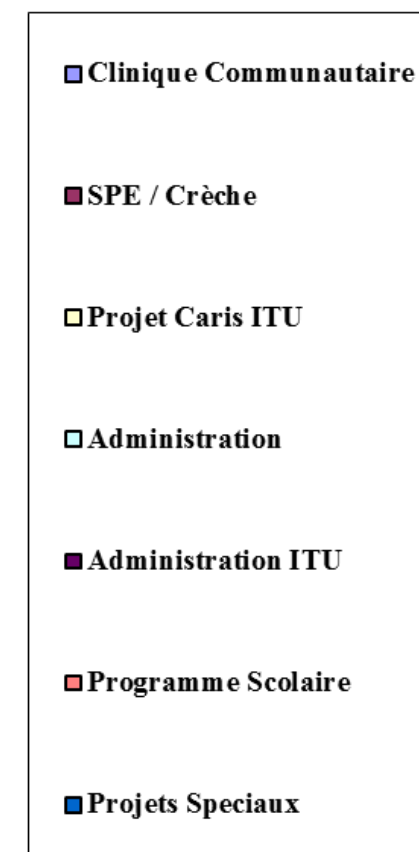
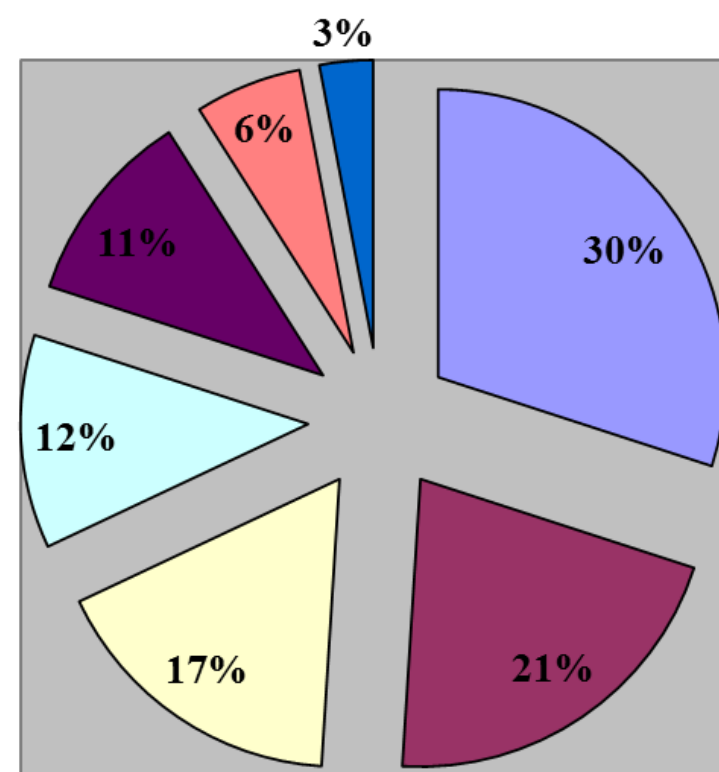

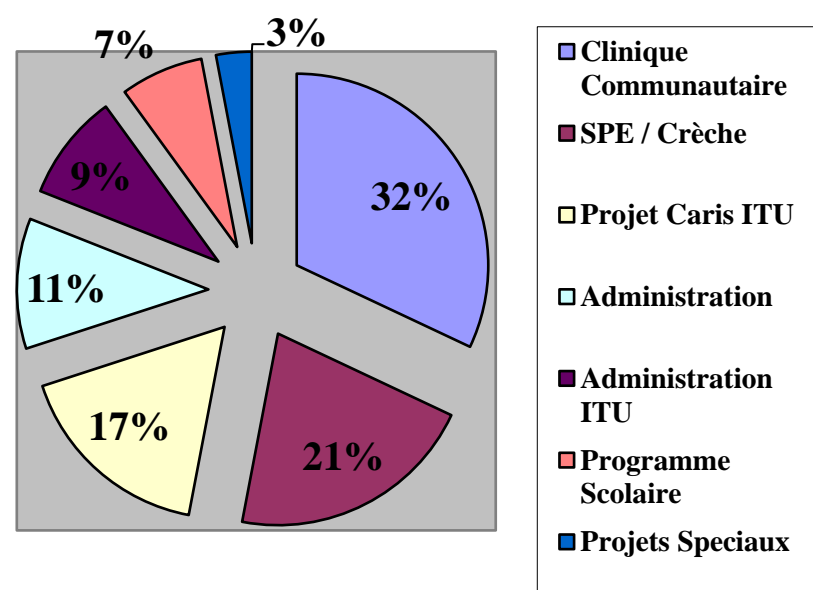
